

Selston Church of England Infant and Nursery School Curriculum statement

Intent

At the heart of our infant school curriculum is the belief that every child is a unique individual, full of potential and deserving of rich, meaningful learning experiences. We aim to nurture confident, curious, and compassionate learners who are equipped with the foundational knowledge, skills and values to flourish now and in the future.

As a Church of England school, our Christian values underpin our curriculum and our ethos. Through Religious Education and Personal, Social and Health Education, we support the spiritual, moral, social, and cultural development of each child. Children learn to value themselves and others, develop empathy, and reflect on their place in the world. We help them navigate their emotions, build resilience and form healthy relationships.

We place a strong emphasis on well-being, inclusion, and equality of opportunity. Our curriculum is designed to meet the diverse needs of all learners, including those with SEND and those entitled to the Pupil Premium. Through high-quality teaching and a nurturing approach, we ensure that every child has the opportunity to succeed and feel a sense of achievement.

Our curriculum is built around the core principle that communication is central to a child's ability to thrive. Through a strong emphasis on language development, reading, writing and self-expression, we support children to become confident communicators and thoughtful listeners. These skills underpin all learning and are essential for building relationships, solving problems, and participating in life's opportunities.

We prioritise the development of early reading and mathematical fluency. Our systematic and engaging approach ensures that children not only acquire the technical skills to read and calculate but also develop a genuine love of books and an enthusiasm for solving problems. Mathematics and English are woven through the curriculum and taught in real-life contexts to support deep and lasting understanding.

Our curriculum is knowledge-rich and carefully sequenced, but also deeply rooted in creativity, exploration, and purpose. Children learn through doing—investigating scientific ideas, designing purposeful products, expressing themselves through music and art, and developing physical skills through structured and active play. These experiences allow them to explore the world around them, develop independence, and learn to collaborate with others.

We value and teach each subject as a distinct discipline, providing children with a broad and balanced education. From understanding their own heritage through history to exploring different places and cultures through geography, children gain a wider perspective of the world and their place in it. Through computing and design technology, they build critical thinking skills and learn to apply knowledge in purposeful, creative ways.

Ultimately, our intent is to create a safe, stimulating and joyful learning environment in which children are encouraged to explore, take risks, and develop a lifelong love of learning. We want our pupils to leave our school with strong foundations in learning, a sense of who they are, and the belief that they can make a difference in the world.
